















# **Website Visits and Database**


# ICO-World Glaucoma Association 3 Month Fellowship Program

- Selection process for 2023 edition will open September 2022: the WGA will make 20 awards available. In conjunction with our Italian member societies, AISG and SIGLA.



#### IGR statistics: production


- The average number of publications in Glaucoma is rapidly growing and so, too, are the number of abstracts to review prior to soliciting expert comments: ~3-fold increase since 1999
- The database now holds over 40,000 searchable and categorized abstracts (by IGR's unique classification system)
- Of these abstracts, more than 2,100 are commented on by 600+ international experts
- AVG abstracts reviewed per issue: 778. Measured over issues > vol. 20





#### IGR statistics: issue downloads

- AVG PDF download: 69,281 (measured over issues > vol. 19)
- 22-1 broke all records with > 120,000 downloads!
- 22-3 just was published (April)
- 22-4 is under preparation and planned for June publication
- The EPUB format is gaining in popularity






